DIRECTOR'S NOTES AND SYNOPSIS

Welcome to our 2018 musical production. This time we are proud to present to you the popular but, in my view, somewhat under-performed 'High Society', brim-full of Cole Porter classics

We meet Tracy Lord's harried mother, throwing a wedding for seven hundred guests, Tracy's precocious younger sister, Dinah (she's grumpy because Tracy is marrying George Kitteridge, the dullest man on earth!) and finally the ecstatic bride-to-be, society's darling, Tracy Lord herself. At breakfast, moments after Tracy reminds absent-minded Uncle Willie (whose house borders their estate) that he is 'Throwing A Ball Tonight', her good mood ends. Dexter, her despised first husband (and Dinah's favourite person in the world), has come back! What's more, he has sailed back in the 'True Love' – a boat which holds only painful memories for Tracy – and has anchored it off-shore, right by his nearby house.

Dexter tells Tracy and her family that a pair of reporters for a scandal magazine called 'Spy', Mike Connor and Liz Imbrie, will be attending Tracy's wedding, masquerading as guests. Dexter invited them, in order to stop 'Spy' from publishing an exposé of Tracy's father, Seth, and his affair with dancer Tina Mara. Mike and Liz arrive and Tracy and Dinah greet them with grotesque affectation, sing a version of 'I Love Paris', Dinah leaves and Tracy proceeds to interview Mike and Liz rather than them interviewing her.

This is an upper-class farce, really a vehicle for fabulous songs. Watch how it unfolds, of course culminating in the happy ending!

I grew up with music from the shows being sung around the house, and have had a passion for them for a very long time. So, it is a privilege to be directing this one for the second time – the first being my swan song at Hitchin Boys' School, where ALL parts were played by the boys! Working with mainly adults offers different challenges! I would like to take this opportunity to thank ALL involved from background crew to the band, chorus and actors, and very importantly to my brilliant production team who have worked tirelessly throughout this past two-and-a-half months of rehearsal, leading to tonight's performance.
